

#### 1.3 Growth of Abhilashi Group of Institutions:

Abhilashi Group has gained a vast and fruitful experience in the field of education by establishing primer and diverse institutions during the period 2001 to 2018. The rich experience in such a short span of time, enabled the Abhilashi Educational Society to establish an independent Abhilashi University on 14<sup>th</sup> August, 2014. In 2001, Genius International Public School at Ner Chowk in Mandi district of Himachal Pradesh was the first institution established in affiliation with CBSE. Abhilashi P.G. College of Education at the same location was the second addition in affiliation with the Himachal Pradesh University in the year 2003. During 2006, Abhilashi Institute of Management Studies at Nerchowk, and Abhilashi College of Pharmacy at Balt (Tanda) were opened in affiliation to the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. In 2007, Abhilashi Institute of Life Sciences was established in Balt (Tanda) in affiliation to the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. Another School known as Chail Public School was started in 2013 at Chail Chowk which is affiliated to CBSE. Then, a major transformation in the field of higher education took place at Chail Chowk in Mandi District of Himachal Pradesh by establishing an independent Abhilashi University notified by the Government of Himachal Pradesh on 14th August, 2014 duly recognized by the University Grants Commission, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, New Delhi. Since then, Abhilashi University not only added several professional courses but also diversified in multi-disciplinary academic and social activities. It is needless to emphasize that the Abhilashi University was established on 14<sup>th</sup> August 2014. Since then, the university management is running B. Tech., M. Tech., M. Pharmacy, B. Pharmacy., D. Pharmacy., MBA, B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture, BAMS, BPT, M.Sc. (Zoology, Chemistry, Mathematics), Two Years Pharmacist Training Course (Diploma in veterinary Science) and Ph. D. courses under different academic Faculties. Abhilashi University is a government recognized Institution with a right to confer degrees as per the Section 2 (f) and 22 (f) of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956. Approval of 2 (f) by UGC has also been uploaded on the University Website. This has been possible after the constitution and approval of the aforesaid mandatory & statutory Bodies of Abhilashi University. First meeting of the Academic Council was held on 20<sup>th</sup> Oct., 2014, while Board of Management (BOM), Governing Body (GB), and Finance Committee (FC) met for the first time on 5<sup>th</sup> Nov., 2014, 6<sup>th</sup> Nov., 2014, and 14<sup>th</sup> Oct., 2015, respectively. It followed a series of meeting with specific agenda items to take suitable decisions for the growth and expansion of this university. Therefore, university provides enough infrastructural facilities and placement cell for accomplishment of academic excellence and transforming the human resource & society at large. A comprehensive record of the meetings and decisions/proceedings of these statutory bodies overtime have been documented and kept intact. #### From: Academic Branch About the Branch:

Academic Branch is the part of the Registrar office which makes the preparation for the new academic session that performs the tasks such as admissions and migrations etc. The admission criteria/eligibility/guidelines for admission etc. are fixed as per the government notifications/rules. The tasks includes the constitution of committee for drafting the prospectus of university, issuance of admission schedule *(Entrance Test),* time-table for new semester/year, constitution of admission committees, commencement of classes, issuance of various certificates required by the students for different purposes such as Bonafide certificates, fee structures etc. *(Required for the scholarship and education loans),* implementation of government orders such as implementation of UGC rules for curbing the menace of ragging, submission of information such as admission disclosure *(to HPPERC),* numerical data *(to Higher Education)* each year and other information required by government.

494 students were admitted in 1<sup>st</sup> semester/1<sup>st</sup> year during the academic year 2018-19. The categorized detail given below:-

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# 3. Examination System

The main purpose of the education is to educate students and help them appreciate the better points of the knowledge that is being imparted to them. And exams have the major role in testing as to whether this purpose is being fulfilled or not.

Examinations motivate and force students to study hard because they know they are going to be put to test at the end of the day.

Examinations help to promote healthy competitions among students. Without examinations students would not be forced to compute academically among themselves. Besides, examinations help the teacher to know the performance of his students.

With this understanding, University has formulated and adopted its examination system.

#### a. Examination Cell:

A separate Examination cell headed by the COE has been created and established by the University and the Cell is responsible for conducting all the activities related to the Term-end-Examinations.

#### b. Term-end Examination

The University conducts Term-end Examinations twice a year in the month of May and December every year. Students are permitted to appear in Term-end Examination on the recommendations of the Dean of the Faculty concerned. These exams are conducted by Controller of Examination in consultation with Dean of Faculty. The Dean of Faculty recommends the names of External /Internal examiners along with their addresses and phone number to Controller of Examinations for paper setting and evaluation. COE submits the names of paper setters for the approval of Vice Chancellor. The evaluation of answer sheets is done by the External/Internal examiners on the spot in the University.

#### c. Examination Centre

Examination Centre is established in the campus of the University only.

#### d. Examination Schedule

The schedule for Term-end examination is prepared by the Controller of Examinations in consultation with Dean of faculty concerned. The date sheet and invigilation duty chart is notified by the Controller of Examination after getting the approval from Vice Chancellor at least 20 days before the commencement of Term-end Examination.

#### e. Conduct of Term end Examination

For the conduct of Term-end Examination a Centre Superintendent and invigilators are appointed by the Controller of Examination after the approval of the Vice-Chancellor for conducting the Examination. The Controller of Examinations gets the papers set and printed for each course from the list of examiners as approval by Vice-Chancellor. Strict secrecy is maintained in the receiving, printing and supply of question papers by the Controller of Examination. Evaluation of answer books is got done from External/Internal examiners.

#### f. Results:

The final result is complied and finalized in the office of Controller of Examination and is declared after the approval of the Vice-Chancellor

#### g. Tabulation of Results

All the results are finally tabulated by the office of the Controller of Examinations for individual student and copy of the transcript is sent to the Registrar.

#### h. Use of Unfair Means

Any use of unfair material etc. is not allowed in any examination. Any student found using any kind of unfair means is punished as per the recommendation of the committee constituted for the purpose.

#### i. Quantum of Penalties in Unfair Means Casea

#### j. Grace Marks Rules

As of now there exist no rules regarding grace Marks to be awarded to the students. Following draft rules have been submitted by the COE to the Vice-Chancellor for further consideration:

#### 1. Short title and Commencement

- a. These rules shall be called "Rules for Awarding Grace Marks in the Abhilashi University Examination."
- b. These rules shall come into force with effect from the date of issuance.

#### 2. Definitions

- a. "Examination" means an examination prescribed by the Abhilashi University under Academic Regulations
- b. "Marks" means the marks that have been awarded to the students by an examiner upon evaluation of his/her performance at theory /Practical/oral/ session examination conducted by the University.
- c. "Grace Marks" means the additional marks which are awardable to the student under these rules.
- d. "Head of passing" means a head under which minimum marks are prescribed in an examination.

#### 3. Examination:

- a. for the purpose of this definition "Head of passing "include theory, Practical and session wherever prescribed.
- b. The minimum aggregate marks wherever prescribed for passing an examination shall also form a head of passing.
- c. All words and expressions used in these rules but not defined shall have the same meanings respectively as assigned to them in the University Act.

#### 4. General

a. The general grace marks if allotted under any of the heads of passing shall be shown separately alongwith the appropriate "#" sign.

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b. If the percentage of the grace marks calculated / revised at, comes to decimal of 0.5 and above then it shall be rounded to the nearest higher whole number.

#### 5. Scheme for the Award of General Grace Marks for Class Purpose.

- a. To secure a class honours or distinction on the aggregate, a student be graced up to a maximum of 1 % of the maximum aggregate marks.
- b. Where class/honours/distinction is given in individual subjects/ heads of passing the student be graced up to 2% of the maximum marks in a subject/head of passing.
- c. Together for (a) & (b) above, the grace marks awarded shall not exceed 1% of the maximum aggregate marks.

#### 6. Scheme for Award of General Grace Marks for Passing Purpose.

- a. To secure a pass In individual subject (s)/ head (s) of passing, the student be graced up to 5% of the maximum marks in the subject(s) head(s) of passing but not exceeding2% of the maximum aggregate marks.
- b. While awarding grace marks for more than one subjects or head of passing, the subjects(s) /head(s) of passing shall be selected for award of grace marks in the order of increasing grace marks required for passing. However, when a student applies for revaluation or appears for repeat examination and grace marks are already allotted to some subject (s) for passing, such result shall not be altered. The student shall be entitled to the remaining unused grace marks only for the subjects he/she has applied for revaluation or reappear.
- 7. Scheme for Award of General Grace Marks when Question(s) is/are Out of Syllabus. When it is pointed out by the student (s) that question(s) is/are out of syllabus and the fact(s) thereof is/are verified by a committee consisting of the Dean and the teacher concerned, then the students be graced:
  - a. Total marks of the question if the question is compulsory and there is no optional question in that section of the question paper.
  - b. The students be graced 50% of the marks of the question if the question is compulsory and there is a optional question in that section of the question paper

# Controller of Examinations Abhilashi University

#### 3.1. Mentoring of students:

The University has adopted the mentoring system. In each Faculty, the Dean concerned has deputed the teachers as the mentors of the students admitted for the academic session 2018-19. The Deans of the Faculties submit the mentors' report to this office for each month or combined of two or three months. The report contains the academic performance of the students (whether it is Excellent, Good, Satisfactory or Needs improvement) and regularity/attendance (whether regular or needs improvement) in the class. Each mentor contacts the parents of the mentees telephonically to inform them about their ward's response in the college/activities in study. They also inform the parents about the attendance of the students. Further, all the mentors' mention the feedback of student and the same received from the parents in the mentors' report. Each mentor submits the mentors' report to the Dean concerned and the Dean after consolidation submit the same to the Registrar office for further information of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.

#### 3.2. AUCET/Entrance Test:

The university conducts the entrance in some courses on the basis of which admission made in the courses. Further, in the remaining courses the admission made on the basis of entrance test as prescribed at the state and central level or merit of qualifying examination.

#### 3.3. Discipline:

The university stands strictly for its action on any kind of activities that creates indiscipline in the university campus.

#### 3.4. Monthly Schedule of Workshops, Seminars, Blood Donation Camp, Vridha Ashram, Bal Ashram, Health Camp and Faculty Development Programme:

The monthly schedule of Workshops Seminars, Blood Donation Camp, Vridha Ashram, Bal Ashram, Health Camp and Faculty Development Programme (to be conducted by the Faculties in a month) is consolidated by the Dean of Studies every month after receiving from all the Deans of Faculties and submitted to this office for further submission to the Hon'ble Chancellor for information. Similarly, regular meetings of all the statutory and mandatory committees/ bodies are held periodically.

#### 3.5. Time-Table:

Every Faculty submitted the time-table for the academic session 2017-18 odd semester and for even semester on commencement.

#### 3.6. Correspondence with parents of the students for the academic session 2018-19:

In each semester the university made correspondence with the parents of the students regarding information of subject wise attendance of the student in the university and regarding fee also. Parents are also informed that they may contact the mentor of their ward for any further clarification whose name and mobile number made available with the correspondence/letter. Students of different courses are also receiving the education loans from the banks.

#### 3.7. Anti-ragging Committee:

In reference to UGC D.O. letter No.F.1-15/2009(ARC) pt-111 issued time to time regarding curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, all the Deans are directed to implement mandatorily the Regulations notified by UGC on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. To step up anti-ragging mechanism university has made adequate publicity by various mediums such as CCTV cameras, regular interaction with the students, mentioning the anti-ragging warning in the university prospectus. Anti-ragging posters are also displayed in all the prominent places like Department, Faculty, Library, Canteen, Hostels etc. Further, in compliance to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment in UGC Regulations, submission of online undertakings is also made compulsory to each student and parent in every year. Similarly, all other statutory and mandatory committees have been constituted in the university. Meetings and proceedings are maintained by the relevant & concerned conveners.

#### **3.8. INFLIBNET/SHODHGANGA:**

In compliance to HPPERC letter No.HP-PERC/CA/Abhilashi/Ph.D/2016-17-2707 dated Shimla-2, the 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 and as per the guidelines of UGC for Shodhganga, the university started the process of membership of INFLIBNET/SHODHGANGA long back and it is effectively adopted by the university.

#### 3.9. Gender Champions and National Service Scheme (NSS):

In compliance to UGC D.O. letter No. 91-2/2014(GS) dated 3<sup>rd</sup> August, 2014 regarding engagement of the Gender Champions in the educational institutions, the university has engaged a minimum of two students as the Gender Champions from every course of each Faculty with essential up-gradation.

A self financing NSS Unit for university has been approved by the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Regional Directorate, National Service Scheme, Chandigarh for the university. The NSS unit approved for 3 years with 100 volunteers. Its works carried out in the university have been appreciable.

#### 3.10. AISHE (All India Survey on Higher Education):

Government of INDIA, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education launches every year the All India Survey for Higher Education (**AISHE**) and all the institutes of higher education required to upload the data on the AISHE Portal. **The University has uploaded the data on AISHE Portal from time to time.** Data required to be uploaded by the institutions is of two types one is the Other Minority Data and other includes the details of Faculty/Department wise courses offered by the institutions, Staff information, enrolment of students, examination/results, financial information, infrastructure related data, scholarship, loans & accreditation and off shore centers.

# **4. FACULTY OF SCIENCE**

Faculty of Science is one of the premier Academics of the university established in 2014. The faculty is having two schools viz. School of Agriculture and School of Basic Sciences which are managed under the Faculty Science. The School of Agriculture was established in 2014 with the objective to provide quality education to the students in the field of Agriculture so that the farmers are well equipped with modern package of technical know how to handle the threats and challenges of globalization. The School of Basic Sciences has been established to look into the problems relating to health, industry and water. This school offers M.Sc. and Ph.D. courses in the departments of Chemistry and Zoology, and post graduate degree in Mathematics.

### 4.1. SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE

School of Agriculture has been established in Abhilashi University under Faculty of Science in 2014. This school is offering B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture (4-year course spread over 8 semesters) with an intake capacity of 120 students. Under the co-education system, the students are admitted to the course after an entrance test conducted by the university.

After going through common and elective courses in Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Basic Sciences during the degree programme, we have in the course curriculum a one year exposure of the students in complete rural settings where the students will go and live along with farm families in the villages and have the first-hand experience of their living, agricultural practices, difficulties and expectations. Students will be attached to an agriculture-based industry in order to acquaint themselves with post-harvest processing of agriculture produce and link agriculture production with industry.

The School of Agriculture is working with a vision and mission to fulfill threefold responsibility:

- To produce competent human resource.
- To educate the farming community regarding the modern techniques of Agriculture so as to make the profession viable and remunerative.
- Continuing finding new technologies suiting to specific needs of the region through continued research.
- To promote the Agricultural education and research to disseminate knowledge in Agriculture/Forestry/Horticulture Sciences for sustainable and productive use of the produce for the welfare of society.
- To develop knowledge about the various Agriculture, Forestry, Horticulture and vegetable crops for the enhancement of production and productivity of vegetables, Cereals, Horticulture commodities in the area

#### FIELD ACTIVITIES PERFORMED BY STUDENTS:

**Maintenance of Departmental Polyhouse by students of Agriculture:** Along with theoretical classroom teaching, experiential education was also imparted to the students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture. The operational activities required to start a polyhouse were also demonstrated to the students. Various field operations carried out by students can be seen from the following pictures:

Along with different agricultural practices, students were also made familiar with some important experimentations like I) collection and preservation of soil samples, II) preparation of vermicompost units in a university farm field and bioformulations of Zero budget natural farming (Like beejamrit, Ghanjeevamrit, Agniaster, Bhramaster, Neemaster).

The School of Agriculture has established an orchard in about 3 bighas land area which is now in its 3<sup>rd</sup> year developmental stage. There are 45 number of plants of different varieties of apple viz. Oregon Spur, Super Chief, Gale Gala, Granny Smith and Scarlet Spur are growing, of which Gale Gala and Super Chief came first time into full bearing after the establishment.

In fruit orchard, various other fruit crops are also grown namely:

- i) Pomegranate- Varieties: Kandhari, Kabuli (hard seeded) and Bhagwa (soft seeded)
- ii) Pear- Variety: Red Bartlett
- iii) Kiwi- Allison (Male variety) and Hayward (Female variety). This year, kiwi gave good yields and better quality fruits.
- iv) Persimmon-Variety: Fuyu (Non astringent)

Instead of these fruit crops; Peach, Nectarine, Citrus, Walnut and Pecannut are also grown in orchard. This year, flowering and fruit size in peach was improved. On an average 30-40 fruits per plant were produced.



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

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#### 8.1 List of Gender Champions: 2018-19

India rank 127 in over 150 countries of the word in respect to the gender inequality. Gender Inequality Index (GII) measure inequality in treatment and achievement between women and men in three dimensions. These are reproductive health, empowerment and the dignity of labor/ labor market. Gender inequality remains a major barrier to human development. Girls and women have made major strides since 1990, but they have not yet gained gender equity. The disadvantages facing women and girls are the major source of inequality. Women and girls are oftenly discriminated against health, education, political representation, labour market, etc- with negative repercussion for development of their capabilities and their freedom of choice. The GII measures gender inequalities in three important aspects of human development- reproductive health measured by proportion of parliamentary seats occupied by females and proportion of adult females and males aged 25 years and older with at least some secondary education; and economic status expressed as labour market participation are measured by labour force participation rate of male and female population aged 15 years and older. The GII shed new light on the position of women in over 150 countries. It yields insight in gender gaps in major areas of human development. The component indicators highlight areas in need of critical policy intervention and it stimulates proactive thinking and public policy to overcome systematic disadvantages of women.

The GII is built on the same framework as the HDI and the IHDI – to better expose differences in the distribution of achievements between women and men. It measures the human development costs of gender inequality, thus the higher the GII value the more disparities between females and males. The GII values vary tremendously across countries, they range from 2.1 percent to 23.3 percent. Women and girls are discriminated against in health, education, political representation, labour market etc. Gender inequality remains a major barrier to human development. Girls and women have made major strides since the policy resolution on structural reform in 1990. But divergences and inequalities remains. Therefore, efforts must be made to bring quantitative and qualitative changes in Human Development Index. It is a measure of average achievement in health, knowledge and standard & quality of living. Human health standard is calculated using minimum value of 20 years and maximum value of 85 years. Education component of Human Index showing mean years of schooling up to 18 years (UNESCO). The standard of living dimension is measured by Gross National Per Capita Income which ranged from the minimum of \$100 (PPP) to the maximum of \$7500 (PPP). On the whole, on quantum term girls and boys may be equal but HDI does not reflect an inequalities, poverty, security, empowerment, social justice, self esteem liberty, freedom, respect and honor. In order to promote gender equality, University Grant Commission felt need to change the mode of interaction at home, school, college, and workplace and University level. To accomplish this, UGC realized to create an environment that promote equal treatment for the boys and girls above 16 years of age enrolled in all educational institutions across the nation.

Therefore, Govt. of India envisages engagement of Gender Champions in educational institutions. However, we have brought this important matter in the notice of all concerned at Abhilashi University. Our awareness campaign in each department of each faculty was encouraging. Anti-Ragging committees and Anti-Ragging Flying Squads already notified in the University also played a significant role across the Faculties/ Departments to appoint the Gender Champions and constitute committees of girls and boys students from various departments under

each faculty.. The list of Gender Champions under each Stream/Semester/Department across the faculties is appended herewith. It is expected that these Champions would not only create a healthy and conducive environment by also restore and ensure social justice and gender equality. Above all, every girl and women will hopefully be treated with dignity, honor, respect and self esteem.

## Pvt varsities to adopt natural farming

SHIMLA, SEPTEMBER 18 Private universities in the state with separate department of agriculture will also adopt the model of zero budget natural farming system and train students about this method of agriculture on the call of Governor Acharya Devvrat.

The decision was taken during a meeting held at Raj Bhawan on Tuesday under the chairmanship of the Governor, with the Chancellors of four private universities of the state on the initiative takun by the Himachal Pradesh Private Educational Institu-

tion Regulatory Commission. This is for the first time that private universities have come forward in showing their interest in agriculturerelated activities and promoting zero budget natural farming in the state.

The Governor said the latest reports of agricultural university, Palampur, the horticulture university, Nauni, and Gurukul farm, Kurukshetra, revealed that the organic carbon increased by adopting natural farming.

He informed that by adopting natural farming in Gurukul farm, the quantity of organic carbon reached point 9 per acre, which earlier was point 3. In addition, 25 to 30 quintals of paddy cultivation per acre was being done which was big surprise even to the agricultural scientists.

On the request of the VCs, the Governor assured to provide them Indian breed cows and also advised them to send their specialists to Guruloil, Kurukshetra, for related information.

He said the state government was working in this direction and training camps were being organised at the village level across the state.
