Report on Patient-Centered Tuberculosis Care

Date: 25th March, 2025 Location: Abhilashi University Organized by: National Service Scheme Unit of Abhilashi University.

Welcome Address by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Dr. H.K. Chaudhary

The session commenced with a welcome address by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Dr. H.K. Chaudhary of Abhilashi University. Dr. Chaudhary expressed his gratitude for the collaborative efforts made by the NSS Volunteers and the State Task Force in addressing the growing issue of tuberculosis. He emphasized that the fight against TB requires not only medical interventions but also strong community involvement, emotional support for patients, and education to reduce stigma.Dr. Chaudhary encouraged students and faculty to continue to actively engage in public health initiatives and to use their voices to advocate for those affected by TB. He reaffirmed the university's commitment to contributing to national TB elimination goals, highlighting the importance of patient-centered care and community empowerment in tackling TB.

Guest of Honor Address by Dr. Arindon Roy, District Program Officer

The Guest of Honor, Dr. Arindon Roy, District Program Officer, took the stage to address the gathering. He praised the NSS volunteers for their tireless work and their focus on patient-centered care. Dr. Roy highlighted the role of the State Task Force in facilitating treatment access and supporting community-driven TB care initiatives.

Introduction:

Tuberculosis (TB) remains one of the most critical public health challenges globally, despite the availability of effective treatments. The need for a **patient-centered approach** in managing TB is crucial, as it helps improve treatment adherence, reduces stigma, and ensures holistic care. With the aim of fostering awareness and offering support to TB patients, the **NSS Volunteers of Abhilashi University**, in collaboration with the **State Task Force**, have been actively involved in initiatives to promote patient-centered TB care. This report highlights the outcomes of this collaboration and the efforts made by NSS volunteers to combat TB in the community.

2. Objective of the Collaboration

The collaboration between NSS Abhilashi University and the State Task Force aims to:

- > Increase awareness about tuberculosis prevention, symptoms, and treatment.
- > Improve early diagnosis and promote patient-centered care.

- > Reduce the stigma surrounding TB and encourage affected individuals to seek treatment.
- Provide emotional and logistical support to TB patients to ensure better adherence to treatment.
- > Contribute to the national goal of eliminating TB by 2030.

3. Key Activities Undertaken

a. Awareness Campaigns and Education

NSS Volunteers actively organized awareness campaigns across various localities, focusing on:

- > Educating the community about TB symptoms, transmission, and prevention.
- > Distributing pamphlets, posters, and other informative materials.
- Conducting interactive sessions in schools, colleges, and local communities to spread awareness.

b. Screening and Early Detection Initiatives

The collaboration organized screening camps in high-risk areas, including rural locations, where NSS volunteers assisted in:

- > Conducting **TB** screenings and identifying potential cases.
- > Promoting early diagnosis and ensuring immediate follow-up for those who tested positive.
- > Offering support to patients undergoing screening to reduce the fear of stigma.

c. Patient Support Programs

NSS volunteers provided vital support to TB patients, including:

- > Helping with transportation to health centers for treatment and check-ups.
- > Offering emotional support, reducing the anxiety and stigma faced by TB patients.
- > Assisting with medication adherence through regular follow-ups, phone calls, and visits to ensure patients stayed on track with their treatment plans.

d. Training and Capacity Building

NSS volunteers received training on patient-centered care, focusing on:

- > Effective communication with TB patients.
- > The importance of mental health and psychosocial support during treatment.
- > How to address the challenges faced by TB patients and encourage their active participation in their care.

4. Impact of the Collaboration

a. Enhanced Awareness and Education

- > Over 400, individuals were reached through community outreach programs, significantly improving public awareness of TB and its prevention methods.
- > Public attitudes toward TB began to shift, reducing discrimination and stigma associated with the disease.

b. Increased Screening and Early Detection

More than 500 individuals were screened for TB in the organized camps, leading to the early identification of patients and quick treatment initiation.

c. Improved Patient Adherence

- Regular follow-ups by NSS volunteers contributed to a 30% increase in treatment adherence rates for patients involved in the support programs.
- Patients expressed greater trust in their healthcare providers due to the continuous support received from the volunteers.

d. Strengthened Community Participation

The community actively participated in awareness sessions and TB support programs, fostering a collective commitment to combating TB.
